Final Note*



BLUE WATER ODYSSEY to be presented in San Diego

"Blue Water Odyssey," a true-life adventure film of a family's five year sailing voyage around the world, will open at the San Diego Civic Center on Saturday, February 22 at 8:00pm,

Bob and Sandra Driscoll, founding members of the AMSS, with sons Stphen 16, Dwayne 15, and daughter Susan 8, departed San Diego aboard their ketch 'Sea Witch' to follow the sun. Stopping first in Hawaii, they then voyaged southwest into the South Pacific Archipelago, on to Austrailia, and thence through the Torres Straits to Bali before crossing the Indian Ocean to Africa, From South Africa, 'Sea Witch' and crew rounded the Cape of Good Hope crossed the South Atlantic stopping at St. Helena and the islands off Brazil. After the criuse up through the Cribbean, a brief visit to the US, they transited the Panama Canal and sailed full circle back to San Diego.

The film depicts robust blue—water sailing, secluded anchoages, and a variety of native cultures which they encountered along the way. Scenes present a montage that ranges from a cargo—cult tribe in the New Hebrides, to a surf carnival in Austrailia, a Hindu cremation in Bali, a game park in South Africa, and Napolean's exile island of St. Helena.
