## Maui

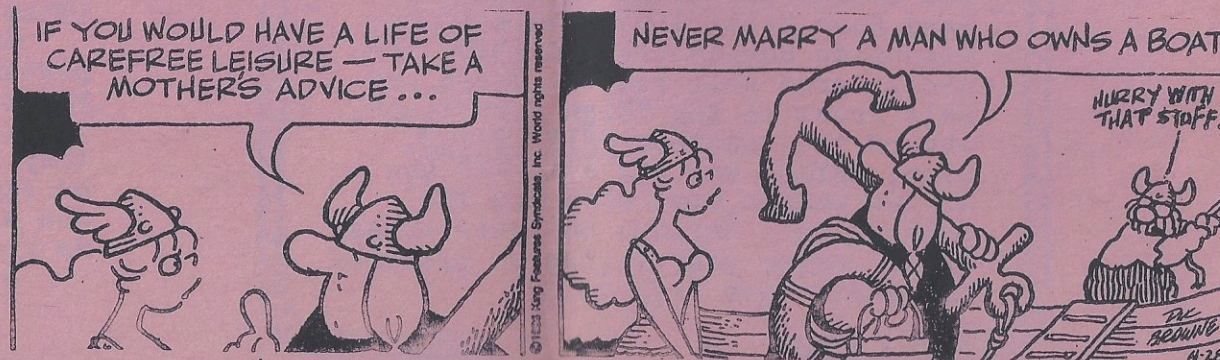

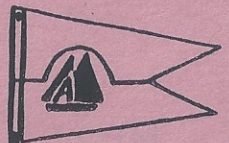
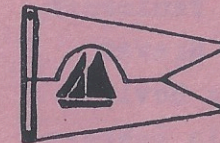
