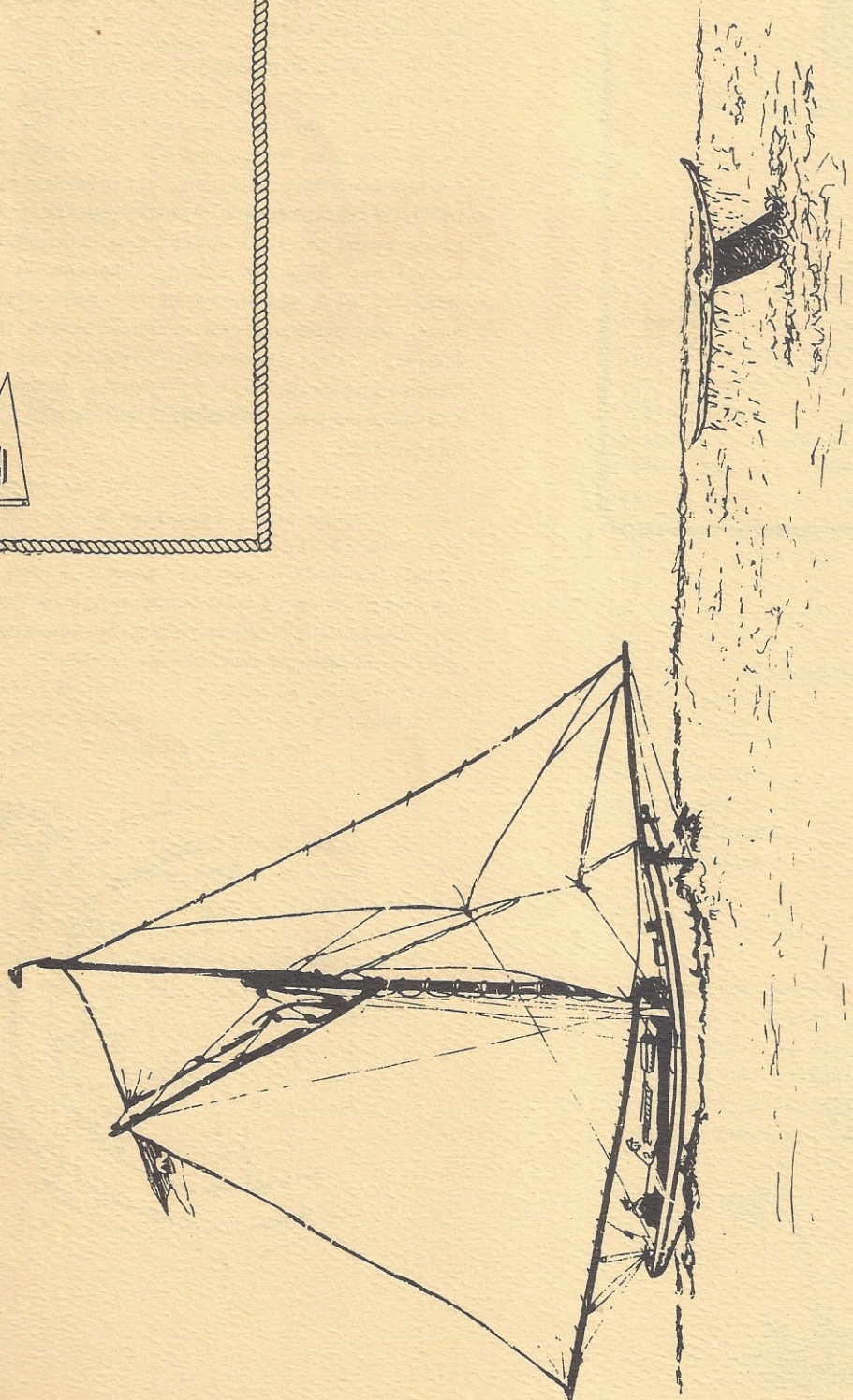

AUGUST MEETING

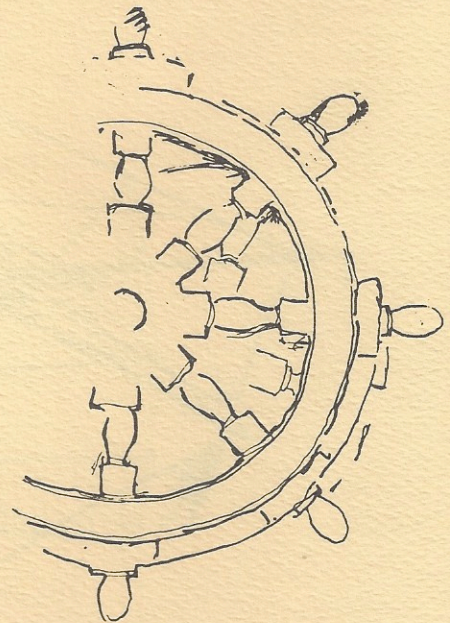

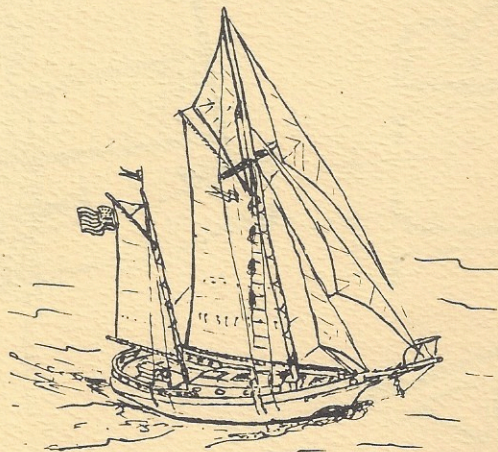
