FEBRUARY MEETING

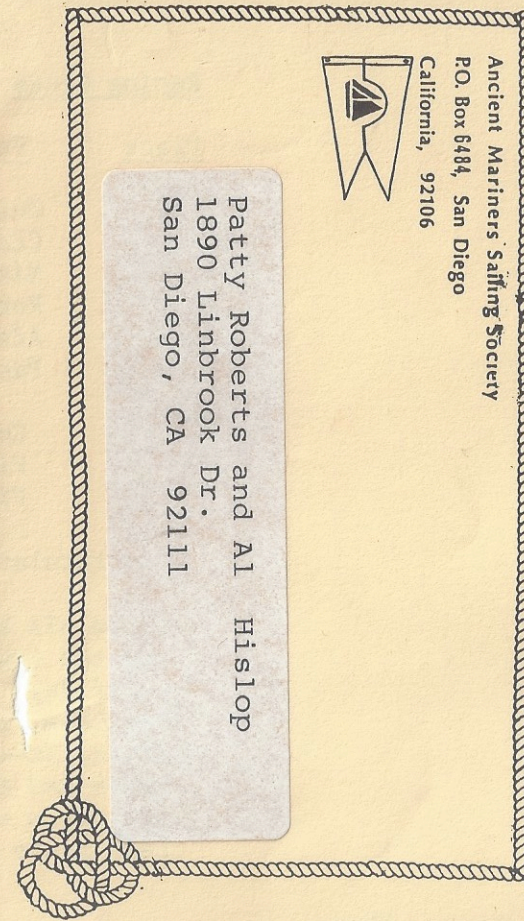
A very special program by Woodson K. Woods, owner and race campaigner of *Scottish Fantasy II*, will show a film about his other life - sailing in the sky.

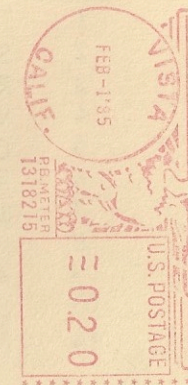
I was at sea again, this time with a very lovable assembly of teak, oak, canvas, and companions.

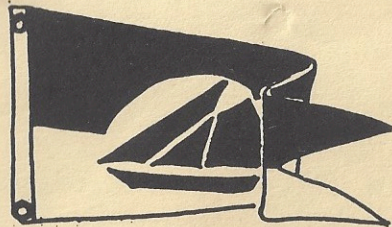
NEW MEMBERS

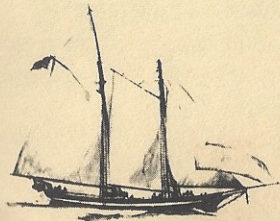

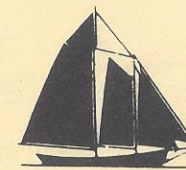
