PORT SIDE by Dick Winchip

The Recreational Vessel Fee (commonly referred to as the "Users Fee" has not gone away or been repealed yet. You should be aware by now that the U.S. Coast Guard is following the below timetable regarding enforcement penalties for non compliance:

A. Public Awareness Phase I (July 1- July 30, 1991) During this period (which has already gone by) boarding officers will advise of the fees and tell you where and how to obtain RFV decals.

B. Public Awareness Phase II (July 31 - Aug. 31, 1991)

C. Transitional enforcement period (Sept. 1- Sept. 30, 1991) Beginning Sept. 1, recreational boaters not displaying 1991 RVF decals will be cited for non-compliance. However, boaters cited will be able to avoid payment of civil penalties by showing evidence of fee payment to the District office within 30 days of the citation.

D. From Oct. 1 on normal enforcement procedures apply.

FEES: 16' to less than 20' \$25 20' to less than 27' \$35 27' to less than 40' \$50 40' or greater \$100
