### FROM A CONCERNED BOARD MEMBER

Our club is at a very low point as far as participation goes when it comes to meetings and events. We also seem to have the same old problem of 5 or 6 people doing all planning and organizing of our events and meetings.

I am personally asking ALL the membership to attend the next 2 general meetings. At these meetings several new proposals will be discussed.

To ease the work load of our Board and Committee members, and to encourage new membership and participation, some of these proposals are as follows:

1. General meetings will be limited to 6 times a year with the 7th meeting in the Fall for elections and business only. (i.e. bi-monthly meetings).
2. Events to alternate every other month with the possibility of small impromptu meetings to be held along with trophy presentations. (i.e. 6 events a year).
3. Allow classic antique power vessels to join the Club. This would increase membership and would provide boats for escort and race committee boats

4. Plan a calendar of events one year in advance, and notify other clubs of the dates. This way we won't have several of our members at another club's event while we are having a race of our own. (This is basically what happened on our past Ensenada Race). It seemed the wind didn't come as well, but that's a problem I won't try and solve!

These proposals and any others you may want to discuss will be talked about at the October 3rd meeting. They will be voted on at the November 7th meeting.

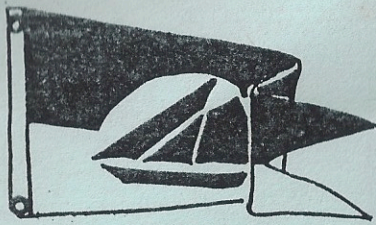
In the days when our boats were built and designed (before Autopilots), one had to take the helm in order to make the boat proceed in the direction desired. Take an active part in your Club, we need you input.

Presently anchored off the Bali Hai, you can recognize *Tacky Lady's* beautiful lines, LOA of 33'10", LOD 28' and a 9'2" beam. We all look forward to seeing Barry and Carmen's *Tacky Lady* in future AMSS events.

Paul Plotts has placed his beautiful gaff cutter *Artemis* up for sale. *Artemis* was built by Meriman, in Portland, Oregon in 1933. She is planked with Honduras mahogany and was built with blue water cruising in mind. Fred Giehler designed her as a seaworthy and stiff sailing vessel.

In addition to being sailed actively in AMSS events, *Artemis* has cruised quite extensively. During the circumnavigation made by her sistership, *Artemis* sailed to Tahiti to meet her and cruise the Society Islands.
