Thursday's general membership meeting will include the raffle of two tickets to the May 4th Luau! If you have already paid you'll be refunded the price of the two tickets. Be there!



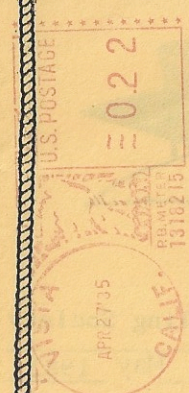
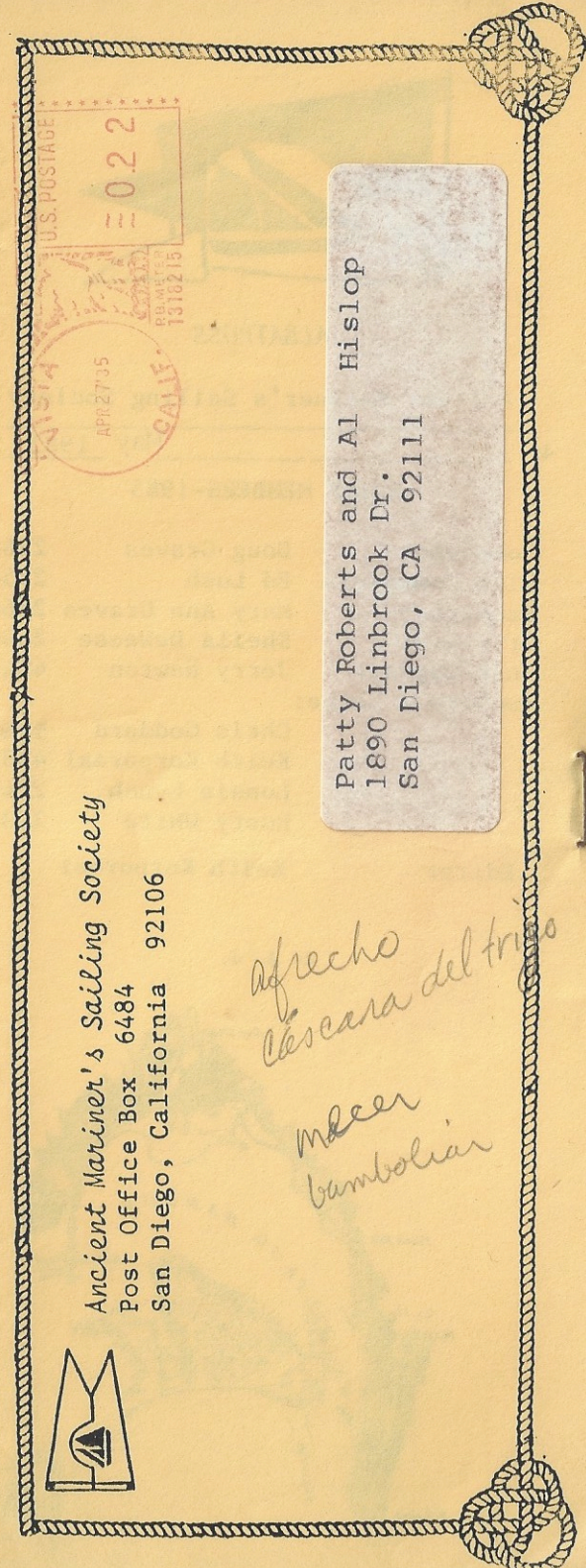
## SWAP MEET

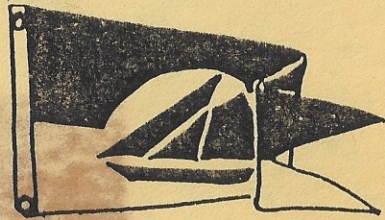

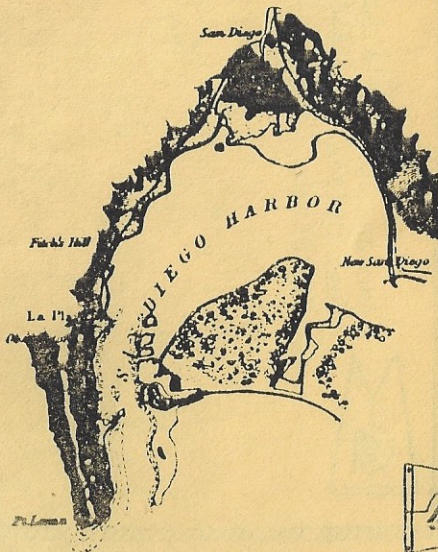

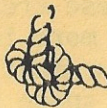
