

Emergency Navigation

A few years ago, five sailors from Los Angeles sailed out of Long Beach for Hawaii, Tahiti, New Zealand, Austrailia, and the orient, returning to Los Angeles some three years later. A pretty heffty undertaking under the best of circumstances, but this particular voyage was unique because they made the entire 24,000 mile journey without a sextant, or GPS, or any other electronic or mechanical navigation device. Still within the realm of possibility you say? What made this voyage truely unique was that they also left the ship's compass behind! These men were not totally foolhardy, however. The voyage was in experiment to determine how the ancients managed to sail throughout the Pacific without the modern navigational instruments, even a compass. How did they do? In a word, great. They never got lost, never hit an island at three in the morning, and never lost a crewman. What they did do was much more interesting. They learned to read the weather, and the seas. They handbuilt star charts to use in finding their way. They reinvented navigation tools that were used successfully for centuries before their voyage.

To learn their secrets and perhaps allow you to rely on yourself after all of the celestial and electronic equipment quits working, try and find a copy of "Emergency Navigation" by David Burch, published by International Marine Publishing Company, in Camden Maine. The book is filled with simple to understand principles and techniques to navigate without all the systems we have come to rely on, some of which you already know, though you don't think about it. Afterall, how many times have you sailed the local area without navigation equipment and never looking at the compass.
