

FROM THE HELM

NORTHSTAR is now ready for the Wooden Boat Festival. Where is a wooden boat festival when you need one? I have repaired, repainted and revarnished everything outside. This is especially true when I tell them that keeping the boat in good condition is as much of owning a wooden boat as sailing one. If you don't like to make things look new, do not buy a wooden boat. I guess the same applies to a plastic boat, but think about this: Who gets the points? NORTHSTAR left Fiddler's Cove at 10:00 Sunday August 18th to go watch the STAR OF INDIA sail the coast. Our timing and wind were perfect. From the time we left the cove we were on a broad reach with the Mizzen Staysail flying and making 5.5 knots all the way. We tacked at the north end of Shelter Island and were close hauled all the way to buoy number 3. We got there at the same time the Star came about and headed for Point Loma. We held her on a CBDR for about 30 or 40 minutes and came about and sailed with her to port until she came about again and headed into the bay. She was Bye and Full and had a bone (a little one) in her teeth. I have seen her in all stages of repair for the last 20 years or so. This was my first time to see her underway close up and it was almost a religious experience. My imagination went right over the horizon of here and now and stopped a hundred years ago. For about ten minutes the crew stopped talking and we just stared, I think we were all taking a trip back in time. We more or less followed her into the bay. As we took the short cut outside the shipping channel I took one last look at the STAR OF INDIA and looked at my boat and thought of the rest of the boats in the AMSS. Repair, paint, and varnish. We are doing our part.


