

WINTER AND HEAVY WEATHER By Rod Latimer

(Considering the recent Commodore's Cup race, I thought this article was timely. Thanks, Rod. ed.)

Undertaking an ocean voyage without a variety of headsails, and the ability to change them at will, would probably be considered foolish by most of us. Regardless of how many fancy big headsails aboard, there will always be a need for the smaller ones, from working jibs to storm sails.

When it is time to reef the main, it is probably time to begin thinking of reducing the headsail, if not now, then as the next step. The permanent or removable inner forestay is a wonderful piece of standing rigging to help accomplish the reduction, especially if the foot of the stay is inboard of the bowsprit. It is a comforting feeling to be able to set up a modest but effective staysail entirely on deck and not too far forward of the mast when conditions are beginning to turn nasty.

With winter sailing weather upon us, this might be a good time to begin thinking about what would be involved in fitting some sort of inner head-stay. The added flexibility it gives you in setting different sails for different conditions can make it well worth while.

1991 MAUI RACE UPDATE By Jerry Newton

As the Maui race deadline nears, the rumors are materializing into paid entrants. We appear to have one of the closest matchups in the history of the race. In the 1985 Maui race, 8 vessels made the starting line ranging in size from the 35 ft., 3-time Maui race veteran, *Senorita* to the 90 ft. *Californian*. With vessels that vary this widely in characteristics it is difficult to generate direct competition between them. This year's race will feature yachts of very similar size and sailing characteristics.

The eight paid entrants are split between Southern California (AMSS) and the Bay Area (Master Mariners). The early schooner domination of the paid entrants has remained static while the ocean racing sloops and yawls from the drawing board of Phil Rhodes and Bill Lapworth have recently come on very strong. In later editions we will introduce you to the Maui race entrants individually with the yacht's history as I get the information.

The entrants from Southern California are:

Dauntless 61' Alden schooner (1930) owned by Paul and Peggy Plotts of San Diego. Paul is a veteran of the 1985 Maui race and recently won the White Cloud perpetual trophy in America's Schooner Cup racing. Samarang 55' Brewer schooner (1934) owned by Ernie Minney of Newport Beach. Ernie is completing a 3-yr. rebuild on Samarang.

Molly Sue 50' Kettenburg sloop (1964) owned by Ron and Molly Bodeen of San Diego.

Rowena 49' P.Rhodes sloop (1961) owned by Tom and Wyndham Jackson of La Jolla, Ca.

Windfall 50' P. Rhodes yawl (1951) owned by Jeffrey Law of San Pedro, CA.

The entrants from the San Francisco Bay Area:

Bright Star 53' Schock cutter (1935) owned by Jeff Rutherford of Richmond, CA. Jeff is a boatbuilder and has completed a 6000 hr. restoration on Bright Star.
