

The key race of the AMSS season, where invited guest vessels challenge our best for the silver, is the YesterYear Regatta. The last last finishers of the 48-boat fleet saw gusts to 22 knots. There were few spinnakers since the downwind leg was short, making for a fast reaching day. The awards party format was a success. Due to the late receipt of some race applications, some handicaps were a bit strange and the calculations took longer than expected.

Critique: Good race; staggered starts a must for the traffic and race committee reporting; some handicaps needed to be grouped more in class categories; race results need to be completed earlier; more food needed for purchase at the party; music should last longer. Mostly, consideration should be given to the impact of the Maui Race. Two major events in one year prevented proper promotion. We could have easily handled 20 to 30 more boats and crews. The answer may be a date change of one of the events or a closer look at the benefits of the Maui Race relative to its cost to the Society.
