




# PORT SIDE by Rod Latimer

Rules of the Road — The racing rules questionnaire in the May edition of Latitude 34 (page 52) is recommended reading to all AMSS members. It's an excellent series of questions and reminders about the finer points of right-of-way and racing rules. It clearly shows some of the problems our members have encountered in past regattas and does much to clear up the confusion about who has the right-of-way in many of these situations.

Turkey Cruise — Several people have expressed interest in having a four-day Thanksgiving cruise to Catalina Island. To make it more interesting, it has been proposed to have a "schooner weather leg" race back to San Diego, leaving San Clemente Island to port. The race would begin at anchor at noon on Saturday in Catalina Harbor. A turkey day evening raft up is planned followed on Friday by an onshore program, including a group land trip across the island to Avalon for the intrepid adventurers. If you are interested in this cruise, please sign up at the August picnic.

Cup Traffic Problems — As we approach the September America's Cup races, the Harbor Police are starting to stress speed control, traffic flow, and rules-of-the-road infractions. The latest note from the Harbormaster's office asks us to remind you of the increasing water traffic and expected congestion in confined channels, such as the entrance to the yacht basic. Sailing vessels attempting to tack through those narrows will be stopped. All vessels must remain on the right hand side of the channels as they transit. They are also asking that any large group activities, especially on weekends, be scheduled outside the confines of San Diego Bay.

## Newport Wooden Boat Festival

The Newport Harbor Area Chamber of Commerce is holding their 2nd annual wooden boat show from August 19th through the 21st. This event is highly recommended! We trailered Queequeg to the show last year and had a ball. The activities are very well organized with plenty of shoreside and in-the-water displays. Saturday's race, organized by Ernie Minney, is a multi-lap short course affair held in the channel and turning basin directly in front of the show. # Petticoat/Ironman Commentary

The blustery conditions of early July completely wanted July 16th and 17th for the annual Petticoat Regatta and Ironman Race. Light winds and a crowded harbor challenged the Petticoat racers throughout the seven mile bay course on Saturday. Less wind outside the harbor and fog made Sunday's Ironman Race even more difficult. The cruising fleet managed to finish their run from Zuniga Jetty to the #1 buoy, but the

racing fleet could not complete the run from Zuniga to the North Coronado Island and back.

Finishing the Petticoat was also a problem for the commodore's flagship. Crew aboard the vessel bitterly questioned the amateur status of the crew aboard Sally, this years regatta champion. "The matching designer sunglasses worn by all fourteen of the 10 metre crew, also known to competitively sail the IOR racing machine, Cadenza, obviously shows semi-professional behavior with financial backing," claimed skipper M. Hilmen. "Such reckless abandon of our amateur racing status endangers the importance of chocolate chip cookie eating and beer chugging," voiced M.A. Graves. P. Plotts also agreed and protested that there should be a limit of three crew per mast, thereby eliminating Sally from the race. All protests were waived by the impartial race chairman, C.F. Koehler, and the results were allowed to stand.
