

In celebration of last years event and preparation for the next AMSS Family Boat Building event, Deb Dominici has arranged for a presentation and reunion at the next general meeting on Feb. 7, 2002 at 7:30pm at Southwestern Yacht Club. Over the past two years, 13 Bevin Skiffs have been built, during the Wooden Boat Festival at Koehler Kraft Boat yard. This has been a true community effort involving many AMSS members, the San Diego Maritime Museum, advertisements in local newspapers, including the "LOG", as well as television news coverage. C. F. Koehler has provided the venue for the event and this has allowed for hundreds of Boat Festival attendees to enjoy the AMSS/San Diego Maritime Museum Family Boat Building event. Historically, many sailing clubs, yacht clubs, and nautical associations have operated, for the most part, out of the public eye. As a result, the public often saw these endeavors as "elite". # WOODEN BOAT FESTIVAL PROGRAM

The Wooden Boat Festival (June 15 and 16) this year will focus on the building, restoring, and maintenance of a Wooden Boat. Mechanical and Rigging skills will also be demonstrated. A BIG FOCUS will be family involvement in Ancient Mariner Boats as well as the History of Woodenboat Building in San Diego represented by Kettenburg Boats and those built in The Maritime Museum will be Driscoll's Yard. exhibiting BUTCHER BOY, San Diego's oldest remaining coastal fishing boat in existence. The Sea Scouts will be doing the food and a BIG Event will be a FAMILY BOAT BUILDING EVENT, organized by Ancient Mariners Sailing Society (AMSS) cooperation with the San Diego Maritime Museum. The event has been held at prior venues and will start Friday at noon before the Festival. Scholarships will be given by sponsors to families based on an essay contest or families can pay to participate (partially or in full). As the WoodenBoat explains on the WEB Site www.woodenboat.com,

#### In the beginning...

WoodenBoat began Family Boatbuilding at the WoodenBoat Show in St.Michaels, Maryland in 1998. That year, we hosted 60 families building -- and taking home -- their own boats. In 1999, we tightened up the requirements somewhat, offered a new kit, and watched in awe as 52 families launched their own boats after 2-1/2 days of building!

To this day, we are committed to the concept of families working together in harmony (and occasional stress). And what a truly fantastic event is Family Boatbuilding!

The premise is simple: Offer families kit boats to build, shower them with instruction (much of it hands-on)... and they emerge a stronger unit, with their own boats! The only "contest" here is to complete the task.

#### You Can Do It!

The theme behind the event is that ordinary people -- in our case, families -- can, with proper instruction, build their own boat in a matter of days. Our experience has been that no prior woodworking or boatbuilding expertise is required.

The greatest single ingredient needed for this event is that families be dedicated to completing the task.

We have been so fortunate that our 112 families have been so committed to the event. They help other families when one invariably falls behind; they share tools and interpretation; and they follow the instruction of the event organizers.

In our case, we have established a necessary prerequisite of each family writing an essay concerned with why we should select them from the mass of inquiries we received. Additionally, we have asked them to write about the experience, and to send us photographs of their finished boats (typically, they leave the event with boats unpainted and, mostly, unprimed).

What is perhaps most satisfying, though, is the



transformation that occurs to the 220+ people who (mostly) arrive at the beginning of the event, full of questions and doubt that they can accomplish this task. To watch them over the course of two and ahalf days... to see the wonderment set in as they realize that THEY CAN DO IT! And to experience the communal thrill as they all launch their boats simultaneously on Sunday at noon, row around, and then tie their boats to the tops of their cars and drive home! "They did it!"

The AMSS/Maritime Museum event will build a Bevin's Skiff, Designed by Joe Youcha, 12'6", with optional sail rig, 100 pounds from the Alexandria Seaport Foundation <a href="https://www.capaccess.org/asf">www.capaccess.org/asf</a>. For this event kits are \$900.00 which includes everything except your personal tools. The preliminary work will be done prior to the event so at Noon on Friday each family will begin building. Doug Jones will be the Master Shipwright for the event. Currently we have two scholarships and hope for more! Full and partial sponsorships are requested and given. #### Commodore's Cup

#### February 2, 2002

**Entries:** The 2002 Commodore's Cup will offer an around North Coronado Island long course Class and an around Coronado Roads short course Class as described below. This race open to all Ancient Mariners Sailing Society members and accepted guests.

<u>Classes:</u> Long Course: Handicap range unlimited

Short Course: Handicap range unlimited

Rules: This regatta will be governed by the 2001-2004 International Yacht Racing Rules (IYRR) including the prescriptions of US SAILING. EXCEPT: For the Long Course, boats that start early will be penalized 5.0 minutes plus the amount of time they are over early. A penalty turn will be a 720 turn (Defined as a tack, jibe, tack, and jibe). Any boat that hits a mark will be required to do a 360 turn, any boat that misses a mark is required to re-round that mark to finish the course or will be disqualified. If you retire from race please call Greg Stewart @723-3078 and leave message.

**Starting Line:** Both classes will start between SD Buoy #5 (Starboard end) and SD Buoy #6 (Port end). The S/Y *Sally* will run the starting sequence.

<u>Finish Line</u>: Both Classes will finish between SD Buoy #5 (Port end) and SD Buoy #6 (Starboard end). <u>Take your</u> own finish time corrected to Pacific Bell time & call in to 723-3078 or radio in ch 69 to <u>Sally</u>.

Start time & Signals: The starting sequence for both classes will be as follows:

Long Course (Handicap Distance 27nm)

Start as noted above

North Coronado Island (to Port)

Finish as noted above

SD Buoy #1 (to Port)

Navy Mooring Buoy (to Port)

SD Buoy #1 (to Starboard)

Finish as noted above

<u>Changes in Sailing Instructions:</u> Changes in these instructions, if any, will be broadcast from the *S/Y Sally* on channel 69 (or 71 as alternative) before the scheduled start time and on the hour for each hour of the race.

**Protests:** All protests to be lodged in writing aboard *Sally* one (1) hour after the last boat finishes.

Social: A raft up in La Playa cove is scheduled to immediately follow racing.

**Prizes:** Trophies will be awarded at the March General Meeting at SWYC.
