




#### THE PORT IS AT IT AGAIN!

The Port Comissioners have now voted to extend the 72 hour anchoring limit in effect in the South Bay to San Diego Bay's north section. The section stretches from Grape Street to the tip of Point Loma. This is all part of the grand plan to eliminate anchoring throughout San Diego Bay. There is some indication that the port is really trying to eliminate long term (i.e. years of) anchoring and that cruisers will be afforded the opportunity to anchor by an as yet unannounced plan. The port seems hell bent on removing what they call "derelicts" from the bay. But in the process they are driving us to a clinically plastic skyline. Nothing with a little paint missing. No aged boats. They are considered "eyesores". But are they?? As an immigrant from a country where buildings 300 hundred years old or more are not unusual, I question this need to purge. I question the need for everything to be clean and plastic. I like to see old things. (Perhaps this is heavily influenced by my own advancing age!).

Of course the fundamental reason behind all their actions is the one and only "gold". The marina owners' association has raised their rates to such a level that people are looking for cheaper options. They haven't even considered

dropping the rates in this economic down slope. Better to spend money lobbying the port for a solution. There are approximately 1100 vacant slips amoung the total 8700 slips. San Diego has possibly the highest slip rates in the



country. And for that our bay's character and charm must be sacrificed!
